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

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


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GLOSSARY

Lifelong learning – is defined as the total learning activity throughout life with the purpose of improving knowledge, skills and competences from a personal, civic and social perspective and/or employment perspective. It encompasses learning at all ages (from early youth to old age) and in all forms in which it is realized (formal, non-formal and informal), whereby learning is understood as a continuous process in which the results and motivation of an individual in a certain period of life are conditioned by the knowledge, habits and learning experiences acquired at a younger age. There are four basic and interrelated goals associated with lifelong learning: personal satisfaction and individual development, active citizenship, social inclusion and employability.

Lifelong education – refers to a concept that views education as a lifelong process, beginning with compulsory schooling and (formal) education and lasting throughout life. The term is often replaced with the term lifelong learning, but the two terms are not synonymous. Lifelong education encompasses only organized learning, while lifelong learning is a broader concept that also includes unintentional, unorganized and spontaneous acquisition of knowledge.

Lifelong career guidance – a continuous process that enables individuals to recognize their own opportunities, competencies and interests at different ages in order to make decisions about education, training and employment and to manage their professional career. Career guidance involves various individual and group activities that include providing information, counseling, assessing competencies, supporting and teaching necessary skills.

Informal learning – learning that results from daily activities related to work, family, or leisure time. It is not organized or structured in terms of goals, time, or learning support. In most cases, informal learning is unintentional from the perspective of the learner.

Non-formal education – any form of education that does not lead to the acquisition of new qualifications, i.e. new diplomas or advancement on the qualification ladder. It denotes organized learning processes aimed at training adults for work, various social activities and personal development.

Adult education - a term that is defined in various ways at the international level. OECD (2003) points out that there is no consensus in Europe on a single definition of adult education for the following reasons: a) it is difficult to define an adult learner – learning, environment and age of learners vary by type of programme and regionally; b) the minimum age for defining an adult learner varies; c) countries differ in their approaches to vocational and non-vocational learning. Some of the existing definitions define adult education as: 1. the whole set of learning processes, formal and otherwise, in which adults (according to the definition of adults in the societies to which they belong) develop their abilities, enrich their knowledge and improve their technical or professional qualifications or redirect them to meet their needs or the needs of their societies (UNESCO); 2. all forms of adult learning undertaken after they have completed the initial cycle of education and training started in childhood, regardless of how long the cycle lasts - therefore, higher education started before entering the labor market is not considered adult education (European Commission); 3. all forms of non-vocational adult learning, regardless of whether they are carried out formally, non-formally or informally (EU, UK).

Leisure education (leisure-time education) – systematic and deliberate creation of conditions for acquiring competencies that will enable a person to lead a creative and active life in their free time (time not dedicated to a profession or earning money in order to solve existential issues).

Adult basic education – adult education related to basic knowledge needed for responsible participation in society: literacy and numeracy, social and life skills and understanding of life in the community. The main function of adult basic education is a compensatory one – making up for missed education and integrating learners into the system of lifelong learning. The goal of the curriculum for adult basic education is to improve basic literacy and life skills in all areas of education. The main tasks are: raising the general education of adults to the level of primary school, training for self-directed and independent learning as a basis for lifelong learning, parallel training for a first profession and acquiring the conditions for possible continuation of education in a secondary school. It relates to areas of primary knowledge and is important for responsible participation in society: literacy and numeracy, social and life skills and an understanding of community life.

Experiential learning – learning derived from general life experience or specific learner activities, mostly outside the traditional (pedagogical) environment.

Knowledge society - a society whose activities and progress are mostly based on the production, distribution and application of knowledge. It is a social community (human society, state) in which knowledge is one of the most important values, that is, where knowledge is the main driver of economic and social development and where society invests in science and the development of experts.

Qualification – implies a formal outcome of an assessment and evaluation process that has shown that a person has achieved learning outcomes in accordance with the standards prescribed by a competent body (institution) and/or that they possess the competencies necessary for a particular activity. It also implies possession of a formal certificate issued by an authorized institution.

Retraining – training that enables people to access occupations or new professional activities that require skills different from those they possess.

Literacy – the ability to recognize, understand, interpret, create, communicate and calculate using printed and written materials related to different contexts.

It is important to point out that the precise definition of literacy differs from country to country and from organization to organization. Today, we are talking about several dimensions of literacy (reading, documentation and numerical literacy), which do not have to be equally developed.

In addition to general literacy, there are also various other types of literacy (information literacy, mathematical literacy, scientific literacy, methodological literacy, ecological literacy, etc.).

Lifelong learning policy – is an approach according to which lifelong learning is the subject of a separate public policy. This policy is broader than educational policy and includes elements of social, economic and cultural policy- whereby it is understood as *policy* – that is, as a cycle consisting of problem definition, identification of alternative responses, evaluation of options, decision-making, implementation and assessment of results. Its creation is determined by three elements: authority (specifically defined within globalization and integration processes), expertise (professional bodies that identify the problem and propose solutions) and order (a shared understanding of how various participants will take part in individual activities) In recent years, lifelong learning policies have gained an increasingly important place in public policies. For example, in the European Union they are recognized as one of the key instruments for achieving its goals, such as the strategic objectives set by the Lisbon Declaration and the Europe 2020 strategy.

Curriculum – a set of activities that are associated with defining an educational or training program. It refers to the content (the material to be learned) and the learning process (the actions and resources associated with learning and teaching). It includes defining educational objectives, content, methods (including assessment) and materials, as well as organizing teacher training.

Learning outcomes – results of the learning process; acquired behavioral repertoires, acquired knowledge and skills; developed competencies in different areas.

Validation of informal/nonformal learning – the process of assessing and recognizing a wide range of knowledge, *know-how*, skills and competences that people acquire throughout their lives within different settings, such as education, work and leisure.

Knowledge – an individual's developmental achievement that arises through learning and manifests itself as a meaningful system of appropriate responses of a mental-verbal and psychomotor nature in situations to which they would not be able to respond without learning. In a narrower sense, it refers to information, or facts, that a person has accepted or has at their disposal within the framework of a science or society. Therefore, knowledge has an individual and social dimension. In its broader sense, the notion of knowledge includes the capacity to apply theories, methods and information to the resolution of problems. There is a difference between declarative knowledge (knowledge of events, facts, generalization) and procedural knowledge (knowledge of methods, strategies, procedures, techniques). In more recent times, this term refers to the totality of knowledge that governs all sciences and human society (see under: Knowledge Society).

Information literacy – different understandings define this type of literacy in different ways: from computer skills and access to information to critical thinking about the nature of information, technical infrastructure and the philosophical context and effect of information.

Voucher for education of unemployed and employed persons – the voucher represents a financial instrument for allocating public funds for adult education. The user chooses the educational program and education provider and the cost of the education program in the amount of the approved voucher is paid directly to the selected education service provider. In the event that the cost of the education program is greater than the amount on the voucher, the difference in the amount may be paid by the user or the employer. An education program for an unemployed person can last up to six months and for an employed person up to 10 months (due to the possibility of harmonizing the implementation of the program with the work obligations of the participants). Vouchers can be used by all unemployed and employed persons over the age of 15, who will be granted the vouchers to acquire the necessary skills for career development, employment or job retention.

ESF+ PROJECT

The project “Further Development of the Quality Assurance System in Adult Education and Raising Awareness of the Importance of Lifelong Learning” is a key national initiative co-financed by the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+), with a total value of EUR 10,469,060.56 and implementation running until December 2029.

The project is implemented in cooperation with relevant national institutions, expert bodies and stakeholders in the field of adult education, ensuring a systematic and coordinated approach to quality improvement.

The project's core objective is to permanently enhance the Quality Assurance System in adult education in Croatia through:

- external evaluation of institutions, programmes and learning outcomes
- strengthening the capacities of teaching and management staff
- developing and promoting lifelong learning through public campaigns, workshops, conferences and national events such as Lifelong Learning Week.

In addition, the project promotes a culture of quality, cooperation between institutions and the use of innovative approaches to learning and teaching.

The project is aligned with national development strategies and the Education Development Action Plan, as well as with European recommendations, with a particular focus on learning flexibility, digital and entrepreneurial skills and the inclusion of adults in continuous self-education and professional mobility. In this way, Croatia positions lifelong learning as a foundation for workforce competitiveness, citizens' personal development and an inclusive, modern society.

Special attention is devoted to developing a system that responds to labour market needs and enables faster adaptation to changing economic circumstances.

Project activities include:

- continuous monitoring and evaluation of the quality of work of adult education institutions
- conducting advisory visits and providing expert support for the self-evaluation process
- preparing recommendations to improve the organisation, monitoring and development of quality
- organising public promotional activities and events such as national gatherings, symposia and workshops
- strengthening the competencies of teachers and managers through specialised training and thematic conferences.

The project also develops tools for standardising evaluation procedures and digital platforms that facilitate the exchange of knowledge and examples of good practice.

The main target groups are institutions within the adult education system, their employees and associates, as well as all adult citizens of the Republic of Croatia, for whom the project seeks to ensure access to high-quality lifelong learning opportunities regardless of age, prior education or labour market status.

The project contributes to improving the availability of education in all regions of Croatia, thereby reducing disparities in learning opportunities between urban and rural areas.

The project supports the achievement of the objectives of the National Plan for the Development of Adult Education and the European agenda for lifelong learning, with an emphasis on standardisation and transparency of quality and on motivating adults to continuously develop their knowledge and skills. The project results directly contribute to greater competitiveness of Croatian society and the economy, as well as to users' individual professional and personal fulfilment.

It is expected that, in the long term, the project will create a sustainable framework that ensures high quality standards and promotes the values of lifelong learning.

Through this approach, Croatia confirms its commitment to building a sustainable, high-quality and advanced lifelong education system accessible to all.

The project thus contributes to the development of a knowledge-based society, strengthening social cohesion and increasing the employability of all citizens.

EDUCATION VOUCHERS



Education vouchers for adults are an innovative financial instrument provided by the Croatian Employment Service (CES) to employed and unemployed persons in order to encourage lifelong learning, adapt to labour market needs and acquire competitive skills, particularly in the areas of digital and green competencies.

This system enables each individual to access high-quality training that meets the contemporary needs of employers and a knowledge-based society.

Vouchers are available to citizens of the Republic of Croatia aged over 15, regardless of whether they are employed, unemployed, self-employed, students or pensioners who are in employment. Users can independently choose an education programme from the Skills and Programmes Catalogue and apply online via My Voucher application or in person at a regional CES office. The approved voucher amount averages around EUR 1,327, with the possibility for the CES to cover up to 100% of training costs at accredited institutions.

The system is designed to provide users with maximum flexibility and a simple application process, making lifelong learning accessible to everyone without administrative barriers.

Submitting applications has been possible since April 2022 and the system prioritises the inclusion of the long-term unemployed, young people in NEET status, persons from vulnerable groups, as well as anyone interested in retraining and micro-qualifications. Particular emphasis is placed on digital skills (programming, digital marketing, database management) and green skills (resource management, sustainable development, smart tourism).

This simultaneously promotes social inclusion, reduces unemployment and supports knowledge transfer in areas that are crucial for the future of the Croatian economy.

A voucher can be used to obtain micro-qualifications, retraining and professional upskilling, with an obligation to complete the programme within the prescribed timeframe — most often up to six months for unemployed persons and up to ten months for employed persons. If the price of the programme is lower than the voucher amount, the user pays nothing; for more expensive programmes, the remaining costs are borne by the user or the employer.

Such a financing model encourages cooperation between individuals, educational institutions and employers and enables optimal alignment between the education offer and labour market needs.

CES advisers can help users choose the most suitable programmes in line with their interests and labour market demands. The voucher system is financed through the National Recovery and Resilience Plan and European Union funds, with a planned reach of more than 30,000 users by 2026. Training funded through vouchers increases employability, adaptability and productivity and enables citizens' personal and professional development, while also playing a special role in the green and digital transition of the Croatian society.

Vouchers are also an important instrument of sustainable development as they connect education, the economy and social responsibility.

By the end of 2025, more than 46,000 people had participated in the voucher system, of whom 25,000 acquired digital skills and more than 6,500 were trained in green skills. The plan is to further expand the system so that by 2030 more than 100,000 users improve their competencies, in line with the needs of a modern economy and society.

These results confirm the successful implementation of the programme and the strong interest of citizens in acquiring new knowledge, thereby strengthening the competitiveness and resilience of the Croatian labour market.

19th LIFELONG LEARNING WEEK

The Agency for Vocational Education and Training and Adult Education has again successfully organised the **19th Lifelong Learning Week** this year, held **from 29 September to 5 October 2025**. Under the slogans **“Hungry for knowledge?”** and **“Thirsty for knowledge?”**, the campaign was inviting citizens across Croatia to take part in a week filled with free educational, cultural and entertainment events.


Throughout the week, citizens could free of charge participate in numerous educational activities — lectures, workshops, round tables, exhibitions and concerts. Many educational institutions across Croatia opened their doors to present their programmes and encourage adults to learn, upskill and develop new skills.

The implementation of activities in all Croatian counties involved 21 county coordinators who connected local institutions and coordinated promotional activities, ensuring broad accessibility and strong public participation in the events.

This year again, the Lifelong Learning Week aimed to motivate citizens to engage in adult education programmes — which is particularly important in a modern society that is changing rapidly, especially in the labour market. The campaign once again highlighted the importance of lifelong learning as a key to personal and professional development.

The European dimension of the campaign was highlighted through the ESF+ project Further Development of the Quality Assurance System in Adult Education and Raising Awareness of the Importance of Lifelong Learning, co-financed by the European Social Fund. The project encouraged greater adult participation in education, strengthening competencies and competitiveness in the labour market and active participation in society.

Throughout the Week, Croatian cities breathed in a spirit of curiosity, knowledge-sharing and learning together, confirming that learning truly is a lifelong process.

CEREMONIAL OPENING OF THE 19TH LIFELONG LEARNING WEEK IN OSIJEK



The ceremony began with an introductory address by the Agency's Director, **Mile Živčić**, who emphasised the importance of lifelong education in a modern society that is changing rapidly. 


Awards of Recognition for Contributions to the Development of Adult Education were also presented at the ceremony to individuals whose scientific and professional work has significantly contributed to the development and improvement of the adult education system in Croatia. **The Recognition for Scientific Contribution** was presented to **Prof. Sofija Vrcelj, PhD**, while the **Recognition for Professional Contribution** was awarded to **Assoc. Prof. Mislav Balković, PhD**, and **Zdravko Čalić, BEng**.



As part of the ceremonial opening, the **17th Lifelong Learning Fair** was also held on the promenade in front of Hotel Osijek, bringing together numerous adult education institutions from Osijek-Baranja County. Visitors had the opportunity to learn about a wide range of educational programmes, professional development opportunities and to get information on current projects, including adult education through vouchers.

“DANDELION OF KNOWLEDGE” AWARD FOR ACHIEVEMENTS IN ADULT LEARNING

As part of Lifelong Learning Week, the “Dandelion of Knowledge” awards are traditionally presented. The main purpose of this award is to highlight and promote real-life examples of adult learners who attend various programmes and forms of learning and thereby encourage and motivate citizens of the Republic of Croatia to engage in some form of education and personal development.

The award consists of a small sculpture, a certificate and a voucher for free attendance of an education programme of the winner’s choice. Over the years, the “Dandelion of Knowledge” has grown into one of the most important and most recognisable elements of the Lifelong Learning Week.

In 2025 as well, within the 19th Lifelong Learning Week, the “Dandelion of Knowledge” awards for achievements in adult learning were presented. This award has become one of the key recognitions within the lifelong learning promotion campaign, because by highlighting the personal stories of individuals who, through education, overcome life’s difficulties and obstacles in an environment that is not always supportive, we motivate citizens to take their own steps into the process of learning and development.

Winners of the “Dandelion of Knowledge” Award for 2025 – Antonia Čop, Zoran Knez and Nikolina Papić

Antonia Čop – learning, perseverance and a love of nature as a path to achieving a dream

Through personal and professional transformation and thanks to learning and perseverance, **Antonia Čop** fulfilled her long-standing dream — she opened her own craft business, **Garden’s Gift**.

Her educational journey began in the heart of Gorski kotar, in Fužine, where she completed primary school. She continued her secondary education in Rijeka and then in Poreč, at the agricultural department, specialising in winemaking. Her love of nature and interest in plants naturally led her towards the field of natural cosmetics. **At the Public Open University – the Education and Culture Institution Rijeka**, she completed a training programme to obtain the micro-qualification Preparation of Natural Cosmetic Products. Although she had previously made cosmetic preparations independently, attending this programme gave her confidence and professional knowledge that she now successfully applies in practice.

During her education, she faced numerous challenges — alongside motherhood, employment and daily travel from Fužine to Rijeka, she also suffered a workplace injury that temporarily limited her mobility. However, despite all obstacles, with the support of her family, professors and colleagues, Antonia successfully completed the programme. This opened the way to an important life achievement — she expanded the range of services of her craft business **Garden’s Gift**, specialising in running natural cosmetics workshops.

Today, Antonia lives with her husband and children in the village of Slavica in Gorski kotar, on a property that once belonged to her grandparents. There, she has developed a biodynamic garden at an altitude of 830 metres, where she grows most of the medicinal herbs needed for her workshops, as well as vegetables for her family’s needs.

Thanks to the knowledge gained through the micro-qualification, in 2024 Antonia expanded her business activities and began producing cosmetic preparations based on medicinal herbs, as well as organising educational natural cosmetics workshops. The newly acquired professional knowledge encouraged her to take a further step — she designed workshops for children, where they learn about natural ingredients, skin health and the importance of using environmentally friendly products. Antonia's workshops creatively and educationally connect participants with nature and its benefits, while emphasising the importance of environmental protection. This approach enables both children and adults to learn about sustainability, natural resources and the development of life skills in a fun and engaging way.

Alongside **Garden's Gift**, Antonia also owns a tourist apartment and regularly runs natural cosmetics-making workshops for adults. Through her work, she shares knowledge, encourages others to adopt a sustainable lifestyle and contributes to environmental conservation. In doing so, she enriches the local community and offers her guests a unique experience that connects nature, practical activities and education.

Inspired by her success and engagement, other members of her family follow her example as well. Her husband decided to pursue further education and obtain new qualifications, confirming the importance of mutual encouragement in learning and personal development. Together, they have created a solid foundation for a family business that is growing in line with their shared values—love of nature, knowledge and fellowship — and contributes to the development of the local community.

To conclude, we would like to highlight the words of the award winner Antonia Čop:

“I believe that adult education knows no obstacles or time limits — it is a path of self-development, discovering one's own potential and overcoming challenges. I hope that by my example I will encourage others to believe in their dreams and invest in themselves regardless of age and circumstances.”

Zoran Knez – an amateur astronomer who tirelessly spreads knowledge and a love of science

Zoran Knez, an amateur astronomer from Split, through his many years of dedicated work, represents a true example of **lifelong learning**, knowledge-sharing and the popularisation of science in the wider community.



His selfless dedication to learning — not only for personal development but also with the aim of sharing knowledge with others — makes him an ideal candidate for the **“Dandelion of Knowledge”** award. As the founder and active editor of the public Facebook group **AstroMosor**, Zoran voluntarily and on his own initiative, every day shares, translates and popularises the latest scientific articles and research in the field of astronomy and other natural sciences.

In the last five years alone, he has translated more than 3 800 scientific texts, giving the wider public — especially adults who are not professionally connected to science — easy and understandable insight into current global scientific achievements. His work is an important contribution to promoting a culture of lifelong learning and developing scientific literacy in society.

Zoran Knez (1965)

Through his involvement in the association **Zvjezdano selo Mosor** (Star Village Mosor), one of the most important organisations for promoting astronomy in Dalmatia, Zoran actively contributes to educating citizens — especially through the project **Little School of Astronomy**, within which he runs an astronomy course on a weekly basis, making this science accessible to the wider public. In addition, he regularly volunteers at the Science Festival, where in recent years he has delivered numerous public lectures.


His original articles have been published for 17 years in every issue of the magazine **Čovjek i svemir** *<Man and the Universe>* of the Zagreb Observatory, through which he continuously contributes to the popularisation of astronomy at the national level.

His work with young people is particularly valuable — Zoran is an adviser and co-mentor to primary and secondary school students who participate in national astronomy competitions. Over the past five years, he has mentored, among others, the students **Nando Dujo Kuprešanin**, **Luka Jerčić** and **Marta Jerčić**, who achieved outstanding results at the national level. In this way, Zoran not only shares his extensive knowledge but also encourages a new generation of young people in research work, scientific curiosity and educational advancement.

His long-standing contribution to spreading scientific literacy among adults and young people has been recognised within the **Croatian Astronomical Society**, **educational institutions** and among the wider interested public.

Through his example, **Zoran Knez** shows what true dedication to lifelong learning and the promotion of science means. His work and enthusiasm fully reflect the values and goals promoted by the **“Dandelion of Knowledge”** award — curiosity, selfless sharing of knowledge and faith in the power of education as a driver of social progress.

Nikolina Papić – an example of perseverance, dedication and the strength of lifelong learning



Nikolina Papić (1994.)

Nikolina Papić left secondary school after the first year due to illness and frequent absences. She married very young and became a mother at the age of 19. At that time, she devoted all her energy and attention to her family and caring for her children. After her first child, the second child arrived and then the third — requiring a great deal of strength, patience and many sleepless nights.

Education then took a back seat. She worked as an assistant worker in logistics for a low salary but her desire for personal development never disappeared. One day, she decided it was time for change and a new beginning. In 2021, she enrolled in an economist programme at the

Public Open University Pouka.

With three small children, daily household responsibilities a large vineyard and the family farm run by her husband, Nikolina diligently attended classes and sat exams. She studied at night, once the children had fallen asleep, determined to achieve her goal. She completed her final paper with excellent results and the certificate she earned represented not only personal pride but also a powerful example to her children of the importance of education and perseverance.

Soon after completing the programme, she found a better job in Zagreb with a higher salary and an indefinite-term contract. Although she commutes more than two hours every day to and from work, Nikolina decided to return to learning once again. She is currently attending a training programme at the **Public Open University Pouka** to obtain a micro-qualification in the production of homemade fruit brandies and liqueurs, together with her husband, with the aim of improving and enriching the offer of their family farm.

In addition, she plans to further improve her Excel skills, which will help her in her continued professional development and in her current position.

Through her example, **Nikolina Papić** shows that personal and professional progress is possible despite numerous life challenges. Her story confirms that learning is a key tool for change — a source of self-confidence, strength and new opportunities.

They opened the door to new opportunities

The life stories of **Antonia, Zoran and Nikolina** remind us that it is never too late for new beginnings and that education has the power to change lives—for the better. Every step towards knowledge, regardless of age or circumstances, opens doors of new opportunities, personal fulfilment and more active participation in society.

Through learning, we become more aware of our own potential and better able to face everyday challenges.

The “Dandelion of Knowledge” award is not only a recognition of their achievements, but also a powerful message to everyone — that investing in yourself is always worth the effort and that change is possible when we believe in our abilities and never stop learning.

RECOGNITIONS FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF ADULT EDUCATION

For the ninth time, the Agency for Vocational Education and Training and Adult Education has presented **Recognitions for Contributions to the Development of Adult Education in the Republic of Croatia** at the professional and scientific level.

These recognitions are awarded within the educational campaign Lifelong Learning Week, which is implemented as part of the **ESF+ project “Further Development of the Quality Assurance System in Adult Education and Raising Awareness of the Importance of Lifelong Learning”**.

The recognition is presented to individuals who have actively worked on developing adult education practice for at least 15 years during their working life as well as to those who have actively engaged in the scientific development of adult education for at least 10 years.

Winners of the 2025 Recognitions for Contributions to the Development of Adult Education

Prof. Sofija Vrcelj, PhD – for scientific contribution to the development of adult education



Prof. **Sofija Vrcelj**, PhD, is a full professor with permanent tenure at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Rijeka, Department of Pedagogy.

She completed her Bachelor's degree, Master's degree and PhD in pedagogy at the Faculty of Pedagogy in Rijeka, where she began her scientific and teaching career in 1987. Over the course of a distinguished academic career, she progressed from an assistant to a full-time professor with permanent tenure (2011) and for many years she has taught and led courses in the fields of General Pedagogy, Comparative Pedagogy and School Pedagogy at the undergraduate and graduate levels of pedagogy studies.

She has participated in and led numerous research projects focused on the development of pedagogical science and

the improvement of the adult education system. Her work makes a significant contribution to the theoretical and practical understanding of adult education, lifelong learning and the professional development of teachers.

For her scientific and professional contribution, Prof. Vrcelj, PhD, has received a number of recognitions, including in particular:

- the University of Rijeka Award for the Development and Promotion of Gender Equality (2023)
- the “Ivan Filipović” National Science Award (2011)

Prof. Sofija Vrcelj, PhD, is also actively involved in professional and scientific bodies: she has been a member of the Parent Committee for the Field of Pedagogy (since 2024), the Regional Scientific Council for Social Sciences (since 2021) and the Croatian Academy of Educational Sciences (since 2015).

Through her dedicated work, scientific contribution and commitment to the quality of adult education, Prof. Sofija Vrcelj, PhD, has made a lasting contribution to the academic and professional community in the field of pedagogy.

Assoc. Prof. Mislav Balković, PhD – for professional contribution to the development of adult education

Assistant Professor **Mislav Balković**, PhD, graduated and completed his Master's degree at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computing, University of Zagreb, where he also earned his PhD in 2016. He has been actively involved in the field of education since 1998 and since 2000 he has been permanently employed at **Algebra University College**, where he works as Director. In that position, he initiated and took part in the implementation of key development projects of the Algebra Group and since 2009 he has assumed the role of the Dean of **Algebra University**.

Since 2008, he has been intensively engaged in the development of Algebra University, its study programmes and its Quality Assurance System. At the same time, he has been actively involved in national initiatives aimed at improving education at all levels. He participated in the drafting of the Strategy for Education and Science and was a member of numerous expert bodies, including in particular: the National Council for Science, Higher Education and Technology (2010–2016), the Commission for the Establishment of the Croatian Qualifications Framework (CROQF), the Commission for drafting the Adult Education Act, the Scientific Activity and Higher Education Act and the Quality Assurance in Science and Higher Education Act.

He currently works as the President of the Croatian Employers' Association in Education (HUP-UPO) and President of the Sectoral Council for Electrical Engineering and Computing.

Assistant Professor Balković, PhD, was actively involved in the drafting and adoption of the CROQF Act and the Regulations on the CROQF Register and his doctoral dissertation and related scientific research provide the foundation for introducing a system for the recognition of non-formal and informal learning in the Republic of Croatia, based on the qualifications framework paradigm.

Through his professional and scientific contribution, Mislav Balković has made an exceptional contribution to the development of modern education, the linking of the academic and business sectors and the building of a lifelong learning system in Croatia.

Zdravko Čalić, BEng, is the Director of the **Instructional Centre**, an adult education institution that is among the first specialised institutions in the Republic of Croatia in the field of training for internal transport and goods handling. The Instructional Centre has a long tradition of training operators of internal transport equipment, which has been carried out continuously since 1965.

Under the leadership of Zdravko Čalić, the institution has continued to develop programmes focused on safety, efficiency and the professionalisation of internal transport activities, thereby contributing to the development and recognition of adult education in the vocational field of logistics and technical occupations.





Later, following the instructor’s directions, they kneaded the dough, rolled it out and added the filling. After the “pera” were baked, they enjoyed the tasty bites prepared by their own hands.

The workshop took place in a pleasant and cheerful atmosphere, with lots of fun, singing and dancing.

Truth goggles: How does a driver see under the influence of addictive substances and fatigue?

Truth goggles are an educational tool often used in prevention programmes focused on road safety. Their purpose is to show how perception and driving ability change when a driver is under the influence of alcohol, drugs or fatigue.

Interested participants in the yard of the **Public Open University Vrbovec** had the opportunity to see for themselves that a person under the influence of these factors does not perceive the world as it really is, but in a distorted and slowed manner, which greatly increases the risk of a traffic accident.

Seconds that save lives







Interesting workshops at the Crafts and Industrial School Županja



Open Days in Split and Omiš

The Open Days were held at the **Centre for Culture and Lifelong Learning Zlatna vrata**, **Studium College – adult education institution**, **Trstenik Adult Education Centre**, **Meštar College – adult education institution**, **Public Open University Libar** and **Public Open University Žižić** in Split and Omiš.

These events provided an opportunity for the public to become familiar with the programmes, activities and projects that the institutions carry out in the field of adult education and culture. Protecting children's privacy online

The lecture, delivered by **Professor Marija Boban, PhD**, addressed the challenges and dangers children face in the digital environment. Special emphasis was placed on the risks of sharing personal data, the dangers of cyberbullying, inappropriate contacts and potential identity misuse.

Through concrete examples and practical advice, participants gained insight into ways of protecting children online and into the importance of education, prevention and responsible behaviour in the *online* environment. The lecture was intended for parents, teachers, professionals and the wider public who wanted to better understand the challenges of growing up in the digital age.

Resuscitation – reanimation

The lecture was organised by the **Croatian Academy of Medical Sciences – Split Branch**, co-organised with the **Centre for Culture and Lifelong Learning Zlatna vrata** and the **Croatian Medical Chamber – Split Branch**. However, the focus of this lecture was not on basic resuscitation procedures, but on different modalities of advanced resuscitation measures and post-resuscitation treatment of patients with cardiac arrest, with a particular emphasis on ways to improve the procedures applied by medical staff.

The county coordinator, **Public Open University Diopter, Pula**, in cooperation with **10 institutions**, held **25 events**.



The lecture provided insight into how dogs express their thoughts and feelings through body language, vocalisations and the context of the situation. With examples and practical advice, **Irena Petak** showed participants how to better understand dogs and build a trusting and harmonious relationship with them. The aim was for owners to learn to “read” canine signals and respond in a way that reduces tension and prevents misunderstandings.

At a creative workshop on textile recycling, through an educational segment, participants learned about the impact of textile waste on the environment and about the solution offered by the **Humana Nova Social Cooperative**, which applies a circular model of textile waste management in its operations — collection, reuse, recycling and the creation of new products from old textiles. They also learned about the work of persons with disabilities, gained new sewing knowledge and skills and created their own recycled product.

The county coordinator, the **Craft College from Zagreb**, in cooperation with **14 institutions**, held **50 events**.



Producing functional objects with 3D printing – examples from practice




At a workshop held at the **Craft College**, led by **Vanja Husein** as part of the Erasmus+ project MC.VET, participants discovered how an idea becomes a real object with the help of modern technology and learned the basics of 3D modelling, how a 3D printer works and the possibilities of applying this technology in everyday life and work. The event focused on the practical application of 3D printing in creating functional objects, with an emphasis on developing specific examples — from concept to design, optimisation and preparation for printing. Through interactive work, previously created 3D models were analysed, their functionality discussed and participants' experiences exchanged, making the workshop ideal for everyone who wants to expand their knowledge and skills in the field of 3D printing and design.
